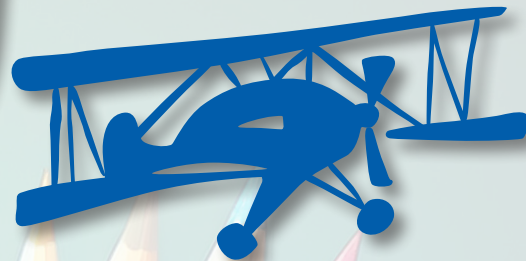

A MESSAGE FROM OUR HOUSE CAPTAINS

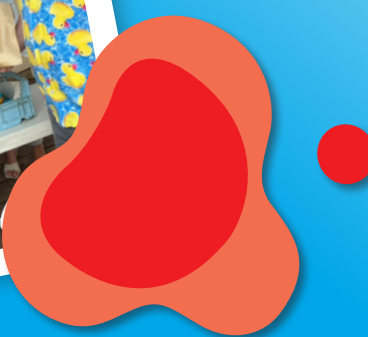

ATTENDANCE TRACKING

Top Performing Class

- **Best Attendance:**
3 SS leads consistently with attendance scores above 92.77% across all weeks.
- **Lowest Lateness:**
TR/AG has maintained the lowest lateness with 0.25% in Wk7 and 0.24% in Wk9

Most Improved Class Overall

4 NR has shown the most consistent improvement:

- Attendance rose from 89.70% → 92.00%.

Attendance Improvements

- **TR/JR:** Improved steadily each week from 87.50% (Wk7) → 88.79% (Wk8) → 88.71% (Wk9). Slight dip in Wk9 but still higher than Wk7.
- **4 NR:** Improved from 89.70% (Wk7) → 91.82% (Wk9).
- **6 AC:** Small but steady rise and consistently above 90%.
- **2 NG:** Improved slightly from 88.35% (Wk7) → 88.81% (Wk8) → 88.85% (Wk9).

Lateness Improvements

- **6 JB:** Decreased lateness from 4.52% (Wk7) → 4.44% (Wk8) → 4.37% (Wk9).

SEMESTER ONE REPORTS

One point that sometimes does surprise parents is the grade that your child gets from A to E. We often consider a 'C' grade to be not very good but in fact it means that the student is performing at the expected year level and that is good. It is where the majority of our students are placed.

Below are the definitions of the A to E grades that teachers will be giving students.

A = Evidence of learning demonstrates outstanding achievement at this year level.

B = Evidence of learning demonstrates high achievement at this year level.

C = Evidence of learning demonstrates sound achievement at this year level.

D = Evidence of learning demonstrates limited achievement at this year level.

E = Evidence of learning demonstrates very limited achievement at this year level.
