Each year the Executive and Teaching Teams look closely at our student cohort and make decisions about how best to organise staffing for the next year. We have worked together to consider the best possible class placements for every child. This year it has been particularly difficult due to the uncertainty of numbers. This means that all class lists will be in draft form and may require adjustments depending on notification of students leaving or enrolling over the holiday break.

BACK TO SCHOOL 2023

The school office, which is located in Urquhart Street Parap, will be open from 8:00am – 2:00pm on Monday 23, Tuesday 24, Wednesday 25 and Friday 27 of January 2023 for the sale of uniforms, book packs etc. Please note that Thursday 26 January is Australia Day and the office will be closed as it is a public holiday. Term One begins on Tuesday 31 January. The \$150 Back to School voucher can be used for the purchase of these items (the vouchers will be available at the front office).

The office will then be open from 7:45am – 3:30pm once students return on Tuesday 31 January 2023.

VOLUNTARY CONTRIBUTIONS

These can also be paid the week before school starts. The Primary School contribution is \$30 per term or \$100 per year (a discount of \$20) if the contribution is paid in the first term of the school year. The Primary School voluntary contribution has not changed for several years. This modest increase will primarily keep up with inflation over that period (only a slight increase in real terms). The proposed increase is consistent with voluntary contributions at other Darwin Primary Schools.

The Primary School voluntary contribution will continue to be used for the purchase of ITC equipment. Over the past years we have purchased dash and dot bots – robotics to introduce coding, lapel mics, tripods, apple pens, green screens, Lego Mind Storm kits, Makey- Makey kits etc. These items develop creativity and innovation.

The Preschool voluntary contribution will remain the same. It is \$200 per Preschool students or \$50 per term. This money allows the Preschool to purchase new sporting equipment, furniture items, games etc.

CLASS ALLOCATIONS

Our Preschool parents will be notified of their start date and times next Wednesday via email. Notification of your child's 2023 class will go home with their report on Wednesday 14th December. Please note that classes have been structured on the current number of enrolments and if these change we may have to restructure some classes.
