Dear families and friends,



Last week our classes enjoyed participating in the National Simultaneous Storytime session. The official story was chosen for ALIA National Simultaneous Storytime 2023, to be celebrated all across Australia and New Zealand! Our fundraising efforts are moving along very well. The Crazy Colour Day is all about Fun! It is probably going to be one of the most exciting days on our school calendar.



We are holding the Fun Run on Thursday the 15th of June.

Our classes have all been getting into the fun by enthusiastically applauding the teachers being soaked as we reach each target.

Now we are up to \$13,759.27. This has been raised by only 115 students. We have over 400 students from Transition to Year 6. The Year 5 classes, our Eco Warrior team, and the Student Representative Council (SRC) have all been involved in designing the first **Outdoor Learning Area** which will be funded through the money we raise in Fundraising events.
