STUDENT SUPPORT AND ENGAGEMENT


The Parap Primary School leadership team, teachers, and Student Education Support Assistants (SESAs) share the common goal of implementing fair and inclusive practices for all students.

Parap Primary School uses the Response to Intervention (RTI) approach, this approach integrates assessment and learning processes into a multi-level system to maximise student achievement and to minimise behavioural problems.

The approach uses data to:

- support students to achieve learning outcomes
- monitor student progress
- provide evidence-based supports
- adjust the intensity and nature of the supports
- identify and support students with disabilities.

This approach is consistent with a range of strategic initiatives but importantly links to the Framework for Inclusion 2019–29.



The inclusion of students with a diagnosed disability is further supported through an Education Adjustment Plan, whereby specific goals are set to enable student engagement in all aspects of schooling. 





Parap Prime News

ICT in the Library with Mrs. Norman

Did you know that we have a broadcast club for students interested in producing student-led news for the school?

Mrs. Norman is leading a small group of students in writing, filming, and editing their own student news broadcast.

One of the club's journalists, Sofia Fava shares her thoughts on the club and the making of student led news.

Why did you join the club? I wanted to be apart of a small group that can co-operate to make a broadcast for the school. What kinds of things do you do in the club? I write scripts for the news and the reporters read my scripts on video. I don't like to be on camera, but I do like writing about things that are happening at Parap School. What kinds of things would you like to report on in the future? Personal things about each student so they can report their news even though they're not in it. Why do you think a students news broadcast will be good for the school? It must be organised, have enough people to do everything like recording, scripting and our reporters who report the news. It will be good for kids to listen to stories from other kids in the school.

One of the club's Producers/Directors, Alexander Schultz shares his thoughts on the club and the making of student led news.

Why did you join the club? I thought it would be fun, I'm interested in tech stuff. What kinds of things do you do in the club? I do a lot of designing (I made all the backdrops for the broadcast and the theme). I also film the reporters and edit the green screen footage. What kinds of things would you like to report on in the future? We should be reporting more about the classes about their opinions, the teacher's opinions and what the students are doing. I think in the future, we will be less scripted when people get used to being on camera. Why do you think a student's news broadcast will be good for the school? It means the parents and students know what is happening around the school and how the students feel about it.
