Welcome back to Term 4, I trust you have a had a nice break as we prepare for some great events for Term 4.

InitialLIt Program in Transition:

There was a need to develop a consistent and comprehensive approach to teaching phonics and reading in Early Years. In 2023, we implemented InitiaLit across all Transition classes. InitalLit is an evidence-based whole-class literacy program that provides children with the essential core knowledge and strong foundations to become successful readers and writers.

The scope of the program cover four main components:

1. Spelling, teaching the alphabet systematically and explicitly, as well as new spelling rules and concepts.

 Reading comprehension and fluency. This involves explicitly teaching students comprehension strategies and how to apply them to different types of text, as well as working on reading fluency.
Grammar, in which children learn key grammatical features and how to apply them to a writing task.

4. Vocabulary, oral language and comprehension through children's literature.

Observations and data show that since introducing the program this year, our Transition students have shown to have better phonemic awareness compared to previous years. Across the three classes there have been improvements with students being able to identify more initial sounds, blends and diagraphs (ch, sh etc) and even beginning reading. The children are more confident and taking more risks with writing.

Uniforms:

As the weather changes, it is a timely reminder of our uniform expectations.

Uniforms are compulsory at all NT Primary Schools. At Parap, students are required to wear the school shirt with shorts, skirts or dresses.

We understand that for cultural reasons, some students wear leggings. However, these must be plain school colours with no added detail (sparkles, patterns, sequins etc.) School shorts must also be worn over the leggings.

All new uniforms and good quality second hand uniforms are available for purchase at the front office. Thank you for your cooperation.

The Northern Territory Music School invites you to apply for your child's enrolment in our instrumental and choir programs for 2024.

Who are we?

The NT Music School is a division of the NT Department of Education that offers instrumental, ensemble and choir tuition in government schools.

What are the benefits?

Learning to play a musical instrument and singing in a choir can have both academic and social benefits, as well as being rewarding and enjoyable. We invite your child to begin their musical journey with us.

How does it work?

Application to enrol is offered to students from Year 4 in primary school and to students in middle school. Students come out of class once a week for a 30 minute instrumental lesson with an NT Music School teacher. Students play and practise at home to learn instrument technique, music reading and performance skills. Our choir program is offered by audition. Successful students attend weekly choir rehearsals after school.

What does the program offer?

Students can join a guitar ensemble or join our flute, clarinet, saxophone, trumpet, trombone, and percussion lessons. They will also have the opportunity to participate in school performances and access events such as the BEAT Festival!

What will it cost?

Lessons are free. Once enrolment is confirmed, an annual contribution of \$100 is requested. Instruments can be hired for a semester from \$100. Sports Vouchers are accepted to assist with the cost of hiring instruments. Students are required to purchase a tutor book from \$25.

How can I apply?
