
Parap School Council Chair, member of Fundraising, Governance & Policy committees

#### **PARKING INSPECTORS**



We would like to take this opportunity to thank our Parap School Community for doing the right thing on the roads around our schools.

Even the most knowledgeable drivers may not know this road rule fact! Under a national road rule, a yellow line may be painted along a kerb to indicate there are parking restrictions in that area. This yellow line means that you cannot stop. It is not acceptable for cars to stop on a yellow line to allow passengers to disembark. This presents safety risks for all road users and pedestrians.

Please be aware of the road rules around schools and don't stop on a yellow line.

Vehicles parking illegally (double parking, parking on paths, across driveways, pedestrian ways, on yellow lines or contrary to signs) may be issued with a fine by the parking inspectors.
