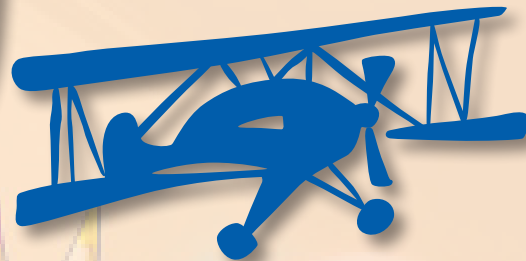

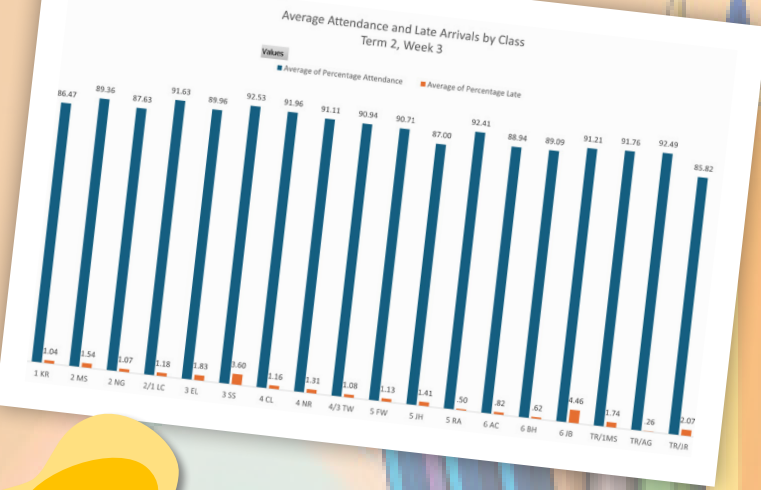

Building Skills for the Future with LEGO® SPIKE™ Robotics!

This term, our Year 5 and 6 students have been getting hands-on with LEGO Robotics during their ICT and Library lessons with Mrs Lawrence. As part of the FIRST® LEGO® League Challenge: SUBMERGED, students have been learning how to build and code LEGO robots to take on all kinds of underwater-themed challenges – from restoring coral reefs to exploring shipwrecks!

Along the way, they've been building skills in problem-solving, teamwork, coding and design – and having plenty of fun too. It's been fantastic to see the students working together, thinking creatively, and testing out their ideas as they bring their robots to life.

We're proud to give our students opportunities like this that make STEM learning exciting and hands-on. A big thank you to Ray White and Laurie Zio for supporting our school and contributing to the purchase of resources for our LEGO Robotics program.
