BOMBING OF DARWIN 80TH ANNIVERSARY

On Saturday 19 February 2022, we commemorated the 80th Anniversary of the Bombing of Darwin.

On this day eighty years ago, Japanese fighter planes and bombers launched an attack on Darwin, killing 235 people, sinking 11 ships and destroying 30 aircraft.

Nomination, Voting and Election:

School Council enables parents to be involved in the decisions being made for our school and our students. We need parents who:

- Support the vision of the school
- Can attend 8 meetings per year
- Represent the best interest of ALL students
- Want to make a difference in our community for our children
- Hold or are eligible to obtain an Ochre card
- School Council Members subject to the Chief Health Officer Direction No.55 of 2021 are required to provide evidence of an approved COVID 19 vaccination except in circumstances where there is a medical exemption.

Parent member nomination forms are available from the Office or available at the AGM with nominations being accepted from the floor. A parent may nominate themselves, with all nominations requiring a mover and a seconder. Voting is via simple majority of parents present and may take place via a secret ballot.

A School Council General Meeting will commence directly after the close of the AGM for the nomination and election of the Office Bearer positions of Treasurer and Secretary.

BACK TO SCHOOL VOUCHERS

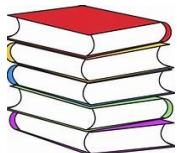

CHIEF MINISTER'S READING CHALLENGE



Every student from Transition to Year 6 in the Northern Territory is challenged to read 12 books in 24 weeks.

Eligible books include printed books, digital books and audiobooks. For younger children, a book that is read aloud by an adult counts towards their total.

The Chief Minister's Reading Challenge starts on Friday 4 March 2022 (Term 1 Week 5) and closes on Friday 19 August 2022 (Term 3 Week 5).

Students who complete the Chief Minister's Reading Challenge will receive a personal certificate from the Chief Minister recognising their achievement. As they complete Reading Challenges in future years, they will be recognised with medals correlating with the number of Reading Challenges they have completed.

Reading logs have been sent home with all students and should be returned to school by 19 August 2022.



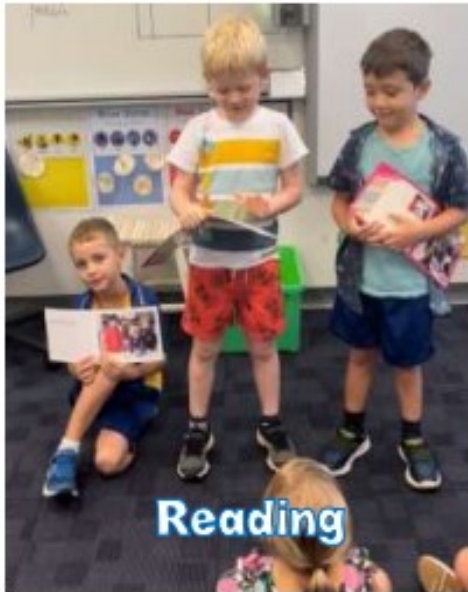
