A message from the Principal

Dear families and friends,

What a wonderful afternoon we had yesterday to host our first Classroom and Community Connection event. Many of our students had practiced showing their parents around their rooms and introducing them to their teacher and other parents. From the many comments we hear, our families enjoyed the opportunity to make connections and we look forward to doing this on an annual basis.

I would like to remind families of the importance of road safety, particularly at school crossings.

SCHOOL CROSSINGS

- Operate before, during and after school hours on school days.
- Are highlighted by orange flags with the words 'Children Crossing' on them.
- When flags are displayed you must slow down and stop before the stop line if a pedestrian is on or entering the crossing.
- You must not proceed until all pedestrians have left the crossing.
- You must not stop on or within 20m before or 10m after a children's crossing.
- If there is a school crossing supervisor displaying a 'STOP' sign, you must stop.
- You may proceed when the school crossing supervisor no longer displays the sign in your direction or has indicated it is safe for you to proceed.

Please use the school crossing as it is the safest place to cross. This applies to ADULTS and CHILDREN. Never run, skip, jump, bounce or ride across the school crossing.

Remember that children learn by example and that school crossings are not just for children ... they are also for adults.

So please set a good example and use the school crossing when the flags are displayed.

On Friday 24th February 2023 we will be holding a special assembly to celebrate our new student leaders for 2022. This assembly will focus on the leadership areas of; School Captains and Vice Captains, House Captains and Vice Captains, and Student Representative's for Year 3 - 6 who will make up our SRC. Next week will be our first general meeting of School Council for 2023, which will be held in our staff room at 6:00 p.m. We warmly welcome parents to join us. Our AGM will be held on the 14th March.

The school council is a body corporate with an approved constitution, whose members are made up of the school community. Under the *Education Act* and the Education (College and School Councils) Regulations, the school council is responsible for:

- Advising the principal about the educational needs of the community
- Building links between parents, community groups and the school
- Assessing and advising on the physical needs of the school
- Determining community use of school facilities
- Managing the school's annual financial budget
- Overseeing work on buildings and grounds being carried out at the school
- Employing school council staff

School councils represent the aspirations of parents in their community. They work closely with the school to improve school performance through the Accountability and Performance Improvement Framework (APIF).

School councils play an important role in helping their school community build effective partnerships to enhance student learning through the Australian Government Family-School Partnerships Framework.

Most council members are parents of children attending the school. Other members include the principal, teachers, invited community members and sometimes students.

Everyone is welcome to attend our AGM. We hope to see some new faces on the 14th March 2023.

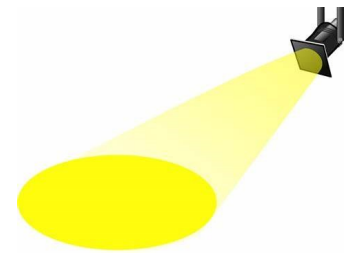
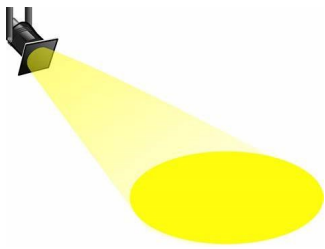
Class Spotlight

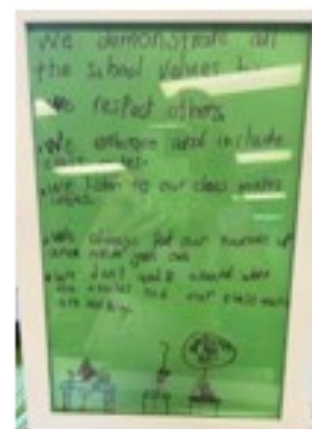
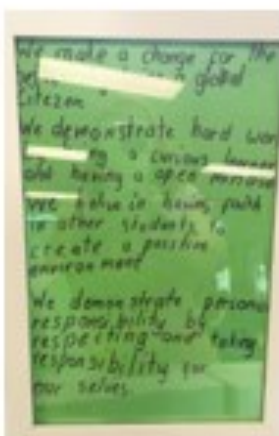

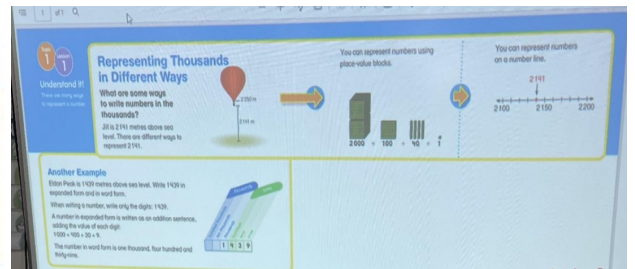
The beginning of Year 5 Bishop, saw a fun week of getting to know each other.



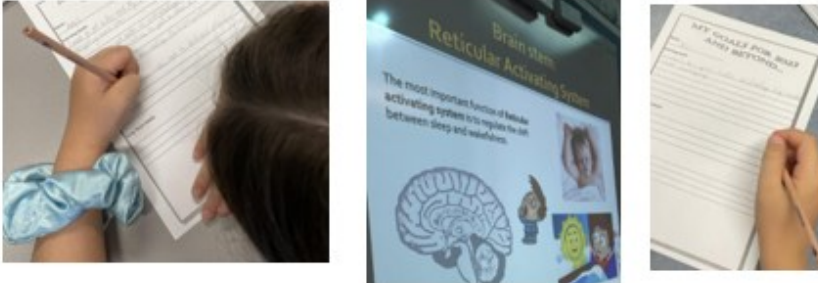

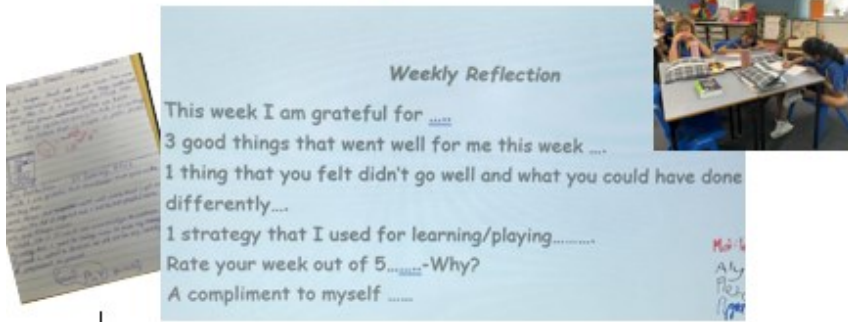
Fixed and Growth Mindsets, Goal Setting For 2023.
